Double Volume

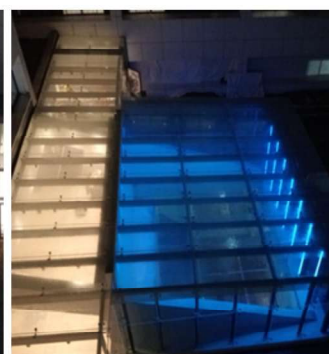
Our new lobby now boasts a higher floor-to-ceiling skylight roof that allows more natural light to come into the hospital. We have also introduced new seating lounges with skylight on both wings of Level 3 outside the Major Operating Theatre and ICUs that allows visitors to oversee into the lobby below as one integrated space.

SKYLIGHT ATRIUM

The vehicular driveway has undergone a remarkable transformation. Now featuring a new Skylight Atrium adorned with a hanging light ornament and a cubic light glass feature. During the day, the atrium let in more natural sunlight. While at night, it illuminates a warmth glow into the hospital. The olive prints etched on a continuous flowing wave form lantern symbolize the enduring and sustainable trust and friendship between our patients and healthcare workers. We strive to be a beacon of light in the lives of our patients to bring them hope and peace of mind in all shades of circumstances.

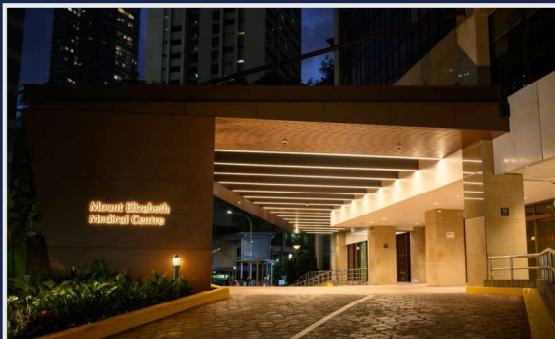

MEDICAL CENTRE DROP-OFF POINT



The MEMC Drop-Off Point was also operationally launched on 26 May 2025 with a symbolic lighting up ceremony.

The canopy has been reimagined and redesigned to allow more natural light into the car porch in the day and to illuminate elegantly in the evenings. It is in progress of being integrated with the new LTA sheltered linkway and is now visible to drivers from both directions of the road.

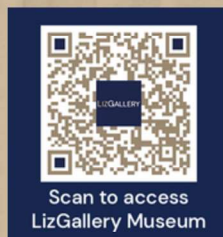
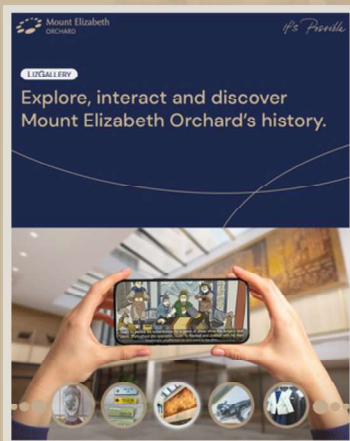

The original artefacts like the Guan Gong mural and the Ming Dynasty Vase, along with doctor-donated clinical equipment like Dr Ho Kok Tong's scopes, among others, deserve to have their stories shared with future generations while they are permanently and physically displayed at MEH.

The LizGallery Museum facilitates visitor engagement with these artefacts through audio visual interfaces, enabling them to explore more about their origin stories and gain a deeper understanding of MEH's history.

Dr Ho Kok Tong is a pioneer in the field of gastroenterology, also recognised as the first physician to perform colonoscopy in Singapore in 1974. He is known for introducing the technique of colonoscopic polypectomy, a ground-breaking procedure for the removal of colorectal polyps which were previously treated by surgical resection.

In 1980, Dr Ho was the first Gastroenterologist to set up a private practice in Mount Elizabeth Medical Centre. He initially performed colonoscopy and colonoscopic polypectomy using fibre-optic technology. This technology was subsequently replaced by video colonoscopy for enhanced precision and visualisation.
